Wellington District

With ANZAC day upon us, there is lively interest in special anniversary performances: Wellington Repertory are producing Soldier's Song by Campbell Smith followed in the second half by a selection of songs popular at the time set in a London pub in 1916, where ANZAC troops on leave have gathered to tell their stories and enjoy a sing-along with friends. Mana Little Theatre are producing *Once on Chunuck Bar* by Maurice Shadbolt and Porirua Little Theatre 's contribution is called Voices from the Front. Levin Little Theatre's 'Allo, 'Allo by Jeremy Lloyd and David Croft preceded these shows in March but continued the war theme.

The District Full Length Festival is under way and has been extended a further 2 moths so will now finish at the end of October, meaning there is the opportunity for groups to enter their third production for the year. Our Local TheatreFest will be held 31 July 1st August at the Gryphon Theatre in Wellington with Sandra Bartlam as adjudicator.

Marlborough Repertory's April production is the World War 1 play *King and Country* by Dave Armstrong and directed by Duncan Whiting.

Amateur theatre is the "life blood" of stage drama, says Dave who is delighted his play will be brought to life in Blenheim. He wrote King and Country to bring music and actors together on stage. Dave and his wife Caroline, a producer, took King and Country on its first tour several years ago, performing at different centres and using bands from each town to play the music. King and Country was also performed in the 2006 NZ International Festival of the Arts.

Marlborough Repertory held auditions end of March for its forthcoming winter production - *Peninsula* by Auckland playwright Gary Henderson. Pam Logan is directing this classic NZ play which is set in Akaroa Harbour, Banks Peninsula, Canterbury, during the 1960s.


Canterbury/West Coast

Riccarton Players lost the use of their beloved Mill Theatre in the Christchurch earthquakes, but continue their positive approach, staging Ladies For Hire in March and two April productions - Knickers and Playbox: Going On A Bear Hunt.

Elmwood Players are currently staging the Irish comedy/drama *The Hen Night Epiphany* and heading into rehearsals for *Proof*, that will be staged in June. Elmwood are also working with Bryan Atiken towards hosting three workshops in mid-year for directors, actors and writers.

Christchurch Repertory have just concluded their season of *Richard III*, and our now busy strategising their future with regards to a replacement venue, following the loss of their theatre, also due to the 2011/12 earthquakes.





Southland


Invercargill Repertory Society has enjoyed a short but successful season performing Maurice Shadbolt's *Once on Chunuk Bair*. The play, popular throughout NZ at the moment, highlights the futile efforts made by the Wellington Infantry Battalion on August 8, 1915.

Rehearsals for Invercargill Musical Theatre's Phantom of the Opera begin next week. Many of the cast and crew were lucky enough to see the show in Christchurch last week and can't wait to get stuck in!

Obituary for Frank Hartley 1934-2015

Life Member of NZTF



Frank Hartley was National Treasurer of The New Zealand Theatre Federation 1978 - 1990. This was a position he was probably persuaded to take up by incoming National President Olga Harding as they'd met at the Karori Drama Club. Past President Pam Logan remembers him as one of those quiet people who fly below the radar but one with a warm and ready smile. She says he really had his finger on the pulse and kept a tight rein on finances. If some additional funding was genuinely needed he often seemed to have a little 'pocket' from which to find it - or knew of an avenue that could be pursued to get it.

When he retired from the treasurer's position in 1990

he then had to be persuaded to accept Life Membership. The minutes record that "there was long and loud applause" for his service.

Frank continued his interest in theatre with 24 years as treasurer of The Drama Development Trust, the small independent charity that helps amateur theatre and particularly members of Theatre New Zealand.

Frank was meticulous in everything he did and even when he had retired from the position of National Treasurer he continued to make a contribution. He spent a lot of time upgrading the Federation constitution. He was the one who made sure that the terminology was consistent, capitals were in the right place and all the full stops were there. A few years ago to help the National Executive he put together a survey aimed at finding out the numbers involved in amateur theatre - onstage, backstage and in the audience. He presented a succinct summary of the facts he'd collected. His reputation for detail was well known and when Gregg Perkins took over the role of National Treasurer some years back he remembers being nervous

that Frank was in attendance at the AGM. He was worried that Frank would come up with a curly question and sure enough he did. Gregg says he thinks he managed to bluff his way out of it with Ewen Coleman's assistance.

Frank always thought deeply about plans of action and often came up with new ideas that would bring benefit to others. He loved instrumental music, opera, reading and crosswords. He was a keen traveller; as well as travelling extensively overseas, he used to make an annual summer pilgrimage to Auckland for the tennis championships and having a life time commitment to NZTF he also used to include Regional and Nationals where ever they were, on his travel agenda.

He was a kind, loyal, gentle man with a dry wit and he will be missed.
