



Hawke's Bay

Theatre is alive and well in Hawke's Bay.

Napier Repertory Players have just finished its season of *Swansong*, a family drama written and directed by Havelock North man, David Moore. The play received an outstanding review by Amanda Jackson, Hawke's Bay Today.

This is an extremely well-written play with three women and one man and with a simple set and costuming, this play could easily be staged by any theatre group.

Napier Operatic Society is rehearsing *The Adams Family* which opens on 7th July. Their show is directed by Rob Hickey. NOS also recently held auditions for their youth theatre production of *The Wizard of Oz* with close to 200 children auditioning.

Theatre Hawke's Bay is rehearsing Love off the Shelf, written by Roger Hall and directed by Wendy Revell. The show opens on 23rd July.

Waipukurau Little Theatre are producing *Middle Age Spread*, written by Roger Hall and directed by Cefyn Gauden. The show opens in early August.

Iona College and Lindisfarne College students are performing *Godspell* on 19th to 21st June.

Napier Boys and Napier Girls High School production of *Little Shop of Horrors* opens on 14th August.

Canterbury

A busy time in the region, with Riccarton Players having completed their season of *ARPOV* (*A Riccartonian Palace Of Varieties*) and Elmwood Players staging the adult drama, *Proof*.





Elmwood also held two workshops - acting and directing - facilitated by Dan Pengelly and Bryan Aitken, which were both well attended and well received.

Both Riccarton and Elmwood, along with Repertory, are preparing plays for the upcoming TheatreFest in August. A number of High Schools have also signalled their intention to enter, so this year is looking to be even more very full-on than last year: So much so that we have a second weekend in reserve, should it be needed.

Top Of The South

Marlborough Repertory's April production was Dave Armstrong's powerful World War One play, King and Country. Presented in association with the Marlborough District Brass Band, King and Country was well received. Back projection of pictures of young men, many of whose families still live in Marlborough, brought a lump in the throat and a tear to the eye of many. The poignancy was intensified in the final scene when the young descendants of men lost in both wars came onto the stage to stand with the actors.

Havelock Theatre Company's forthcoming production, The Last Heart, is a fun family production written and directed by Rick Edmonds. With a cast of 20, the play is initially set in modern day Havelock, but somehow finds it way to Ancient Rome and then back to Havelock. Performance season is mid-September in the Havelock Town Hall. Congratulations to Rick who was recently made a Member of the New Zealand Order of Merit for his services to the arts and the community in Marlborough. He is the principal playwright and director for the Havelock Theatre Company, and is best known for his paintings,
