"Chchch changes....."

Not only a tip of the hat to David Bowie, but also to announce that Theatre New Zealand is expanding its **TheatreFest** capabilities.

Since its inception, entries have needed to be between 15 and 50 minutes playing time, regardless of performance genre – play, musical or physical theatre. We've also had the 'new play' Olga E. Harding Award, supporting new playwrights entering the festival; something for everybody, the Theatre New Zealand maxim being Participate, Educate, Innovate.



So, listening to your comments and feedback over the past couple of years, plus wanting to accommodate the 'short, sharp and pithy', we have decided to introduce a new category for performance: **Under 15 minutes.** This new category will pave the way for you to create innovative theatre, in a concise and succinct way. You may wish to speak to us in play form – but equally well you may wish to use dance-drama, or even interconnecting songs on a theme, to make your observation. The possibilities are endless. Theatre on the edge is exciting stimulating and challenging to us all.

Aligned to this – ANZDA adjudicators are having a professional development weekend in Wellington early March to refresh criteria, content, standards of approach, marking, skills and assimilation of new trends in theatrical approach. Read about ANZDA on page 4.

Innovative theatre at this level (one-act performance) can easily lead on to major works of inspiration. Seize the day – the conditions of entry are still the same in this new section – a minimum of two players and this new category is open to all the existing awards.

Stop Press!

You don't even need to be part of a 'local festival system' to enter. If you wish to enter TheatreFest at any time between October and July because it suits your theatre programming better or you are too far away from a proposed local theatreFest destination, simply register your interest with the National Administrator and arrange to be adjudicated. If the production is deemed to be of 'Regional TheatreFest standard' you simply enter then at that level and continue through the process according to the national scheduled programme.

The Association of New Zealand Drama Adjudicators (ANZDA) was founded in 1980 to improve the standards and consistency of adjudication of non-professional theatre. Its members can be relied upon to adhere to a set of principles that maintain a uniformity of adjudication practices.

ANZDA's Mission Statement is:

To promote and foster a high standard of non-professional theatre in Aotearoa/New Zealand, through the adjudication of theatrical presentations, including Festivals and through informed greenroom discussions and written reports. To maintain a uniformity of adjudicating standards.

Any type of production or presentation can be adjudicated by an Accredited ANZDA member. This can include straight theatre, musical, mime, dance, improvised theatre etc and can be full length. These can occur in Festivals such as TheatreFest, Sheilah Winn Shakespeare Festivals or Full Length Play Festivals.

An adjudication covers three main areas which are;

The Essence of Adjudication which is a Knowledge and understanding of the medium used and Objectivity – Evaluation – Education – Improvement – Growth.

The Process of Adjudication which is to assess objectively, give constructive evaluation and to inform the audience, performers, directors and production team.

The Outcome of Adjudication which is to encourage performers, directors and production teams, affirm positive aspects of the work presented, give constructive pointers for improved theatrical presentation and foster audience appreciation of the medium.

ANZDA maintains its standards by undertaking professional development seminars for its members and peer assessments and regards the role and responsibility of an Adjudicator as being able to assess with objective integrity, without prejudice or bias and to conduct themselves in a professional manner.
